


## Long Island Creatives Line Up To Perform In Port Jefferson Show Featuring True Stories, With A Twist

Staecy Altherr is a New York Newsday reporter who covers the East End. She was a principal researcher for many years, and worked on team projects such as investigative series into fire districts, pollution at Brookhaven National Laboratory and the rise of special education. Altherr won the Silurian Award in 2010 as part of a team covering the heroin epidemic, and was also part of the Newsday team that won the Pulitzer Award for coverage of the TWA Flight 800 crash in 1996.

Stevie GB is a regular on the Long Island Comedy Festival and award winning comedian, Stevie has

performed at The Borgata, Catch a
Rising Star, The Paramount, and
countless other venues. He's performed
with comedy legends like Louie
Anderson, Kevin Meaney, Rob
