

## Important honour for University Hospital of South Manchester doctors and scientists fighting fungal diseases

The University Hospital of South Manchester (UHSM) recognised as a centre of excellence for the treatment of aspergillosis and other fungal infections

The Mycology Reference Centre

with the National Aspergillosis Centre

award. It recognises their collaboration in
better understanding medical issues
related to mycology – the scientific study
of fungi.

a specialist National Health Service Medical Mycology Reference Service to patients throughout the UK and acts as a focus for national and international training and research in Medical Mycology in the UK. The National Aspergillosis Centre (NAC), the first national centre for aspergillosis in the world is led by Professor David Denning, and benefits patients across the UK, by building on the extensive expertise in chronic fungal lung infections with sophisticated laboratory support provided by the MRCM.

Professor Richardson explains: "While there have been some significant improvements in diagnostic tests and therapeutic choices for fungal diseases over the last 15 years, access to appropriate diagnostics and treatment is far from universal within Europe and globally. In many countries inadequate expertise in clinical management and diagnostic capability are major issues that need to be addressed. The network of ECMM Centres of Excellence will direct clinicians, patients, and their relatives to an appropriate and capable centre that can provide advice and training. We are delighted and honoured that Manchester is to be the first."

Professor Denning adds; "This partnership has allowed expansion of our clinical and research capabilities which provides us with us with a strong base to collaborate with other European Centres
