The Utica Shale has contributed to the rapid increase in natural gas production in Ohio, which was more than 12 times greater in 2015 than 2011. Ohio had the seventh largest crude oil refining capacity in the nation in 2015. Coal fueled 59% of Ohio's net electricity generation in 2015, natural gas contributed 23%, and nuclear energy accounted for another 14%. Ohio ranked seventh in the nation in 2013 in energy consumption by the industrial sector. Output from Ohio's factories accounted for 17% of the state's gross domestic product (GDP) in 2014, and contributed 4.7% to the total U.S. manufacturing GDP in 2014.
