

Can you rely on your tires to hold up in an accident?

Consumer affairs unearths faulty tire pressure monitoring systems forcing Chrysler to recall 278 model year 2017 Fiats.

The company Travelsafer are keen to alert the public that the TPSM does not replace the need for regular tire pressure checks. It's a tool that can help alert you when pressure is low, but a tire may drop well below proper inflation risking poor contact with the road long before the TPMS warning light comes on. The TPMS light only comes on when the tire pressure gets too low or too high.

Depending on the situation, the TPMS may not accurately transmit data to the

on-board computer, or may not accurately determine the tire pressures if multiple tires are losing pressure at the same time.

- Tires underinflated by 25 percent or more, are 3 times as likely to be cited as critical events in the pre-crash phase.
- A sudden drop in air temperature in stormy weather could put you at risk of an accident
- For every 6-degree temperature decrease, tire pressure drops between one pound per square inch. Tire manufacturers agree that drivers should check their tire pressure at least once a month, but during the winter months regular checking tire pressures is even more critical.

Brad from Travelsafer explains, "Maintaining proper tire pressure is essential to vehicle handling, fuel efficiency, tire performance and load carrying capabilities. Properly inflated tires minimize risk of tire

failure by reducing tread movement and rolling resistance, and increasing water dispersion in the wet."
