

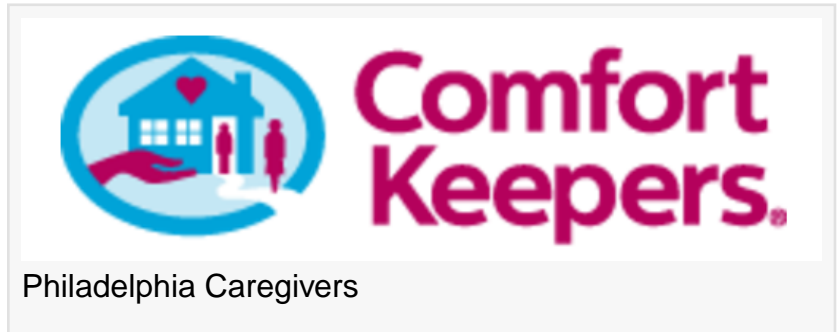
Comfort keepers® In Home caregivers assisted the Philadelphia Phillies
