

San Jose City College Accreditation Fully Reaffirmed

ACCJC accreditation is a hallmark of excellence.

SAN JOSE, CALIFORNIA, UNITED STATES, June 15, 2018 /EINPresswire.com/ -- San José City College ([SJCC](#)) learned this week that it received reaffirmation of its [accreditation](#) status until 2023 by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges ([ACCJC](#)).

The reaffirmed accreditation comes after ACCJC reviewed follow-up reports and evidentiary materials submitted in March 2018 after ACCJC accreditation site visits in October 2016.

In a letter to SJCC president Dr. Byron D. Clift Breland, ACCJC President Richard Winn expressed his appreciation “for the diligent work and thoughtful reflection” the College took in preparing its accreditation reports and materials.

SJCC’s sister campus Evergreen Valley College also had its accreditation status reaffirmed.

Before SJCC’s next comprehensive review in fall of 2023, the institution will provide midterm reports in October 2020.
